In today's world road transportation has become integral part of people's daily lives. Every body is a road user in one shape or the other. The present transport system has minimized the distances but it has on the other hand increased the life risk. Every year road crashes result in loss of lakhs of lives and serious injuries to crores of people.

- The Government of India is deeply concerned about the growth in the number of road accidents, injuries and fatalities in recent years. It recognizes that road accidents have now become a major public health issue, and the victims are mainly the poor and vulnerable road users.
- The Government of India further recognizes that as road accidents involve roads, motor vehicles as also the human beings, road safety needs to be addressed on a holistic basis. It also recognizes that regardless of jurisdiction, the Central and State Governments have a joint responsibility in reducing the incidence of road accidents, injuries and fatalities.
- In the light of this, the Government of India, through this National Road Safety Policy, states its commitment to bring about a significant reduction in mortality and morbidity resulting from road accidents.

In order to achieve a significant improvement in road safety, the Government of India is committed to Raise Awareness about Road Safety Issues.

The Government would increase its efforts to promote awareness about the various aspects of road safety, the social and economic implications of road accidents and what needs to be done to curb the rising menace of road accidents. This would enable and empower the different stakeholders to play a meaningful role in promoting road safety.

# SUMMARY OF SIAM'S NATIONAL ROAD SAFETY MONTH ACTIVITIES

The Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) under the aegis of Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) concluded a month-long nationwide initiative of 32nd National Road Safety Month organised on the theme 'Sadak Suraksha Jeevan Raksha'.

Under the initiative, SIAM conducted various activities during the month and launched the virtual road safety educational gallery, which remained the pivotal point of attraction throughout the month.

Designed with the objective of educating stakeholders, and the general public about road safety, the gallery sought to spread awareness and discipline on roads and drivers' behavioural changes through encouraging best practices for road safety.

In the course of one month, SIAM along with its members and stakeholders reached approximately one million citizens, propagating the message of 'Sadak Suraksha Jeevan Raksha'. A series of road safety awareness and training activities were organised by SIAM for drivers of the truck, bus and three-wheeler including school and college students, women riders and citizens at large.





A Unique Virtual Road Safety Education Gallery created by SIAM with the support of its member companies for sharing all the information related to road safety at one place. It was launched on 18th January 2021.

Safe driving, health and eye check-up camps were organised for the drivers in more than 25 locations countrywide. SIAM with ASRTU also organised road safety awareness virtual workshops for STU drivers across the nation and trained more than 11,000 drivers.





SIAM, along with Sight Saver and TCI Foundation organised free health and eye check-up camps at more than 26 locations across the nation. Also organised virtual road safety awareness sessions for Commercial Vehicle Drivers during National Road Safety Month.

The objective of these sessions were to support drivers by providing them information on road rules & regulations, provide them with free health consultancy and free medicines and spectacles. Through its road safety awareness sessions for



drivers, SIAM was able to inculcate the knowledge on road rules and regulations for their own safety and for others safety too.

SIAM along with MoRTH also organized two virtual seminars on Implementation of Vehicle Location Tracking Devices for Enhancement of Safety on Road and Emerging Technologies for Safer Mobility with the aim of educating and disseminating information on safety standards and holistic approach in bringing the safety through vehicular technology.

SIAM and its members across the nation in each and every state of India organised Road Safety Awareness drives for students, drivers and public.



#### SIAM's Unique Virtual Road Safety Education Gallery:




### **Auditorium for organising Road Safety Interactions**








### Free Eye Check up Camps at 16 toll plazas in India

# HEALTH CHECK UP CAMPS & TRAINING SESSION FOR COMMERCIAL VEHICLE DRIVERS

### Road Safety Refresher Health Check up Camps & training sessions for Commercial Vehicle Drivers at 10 Transport Hubs

Road Safety for Long Distance Truck Drivers in India

Society of Indian automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) in technical collaboration with TCI Foundation and AADMS Foundation observed the road safety week for long distance truck drivers in the country. Millions of trucks are registered to operate on India's roadways and play a critical role in helping move our nation's economy. Trucks are much more difficult to manoeuvre, have massive blind spots, and take far longer to stop. Awareness of differences between truck driving and other vehicle driving, and some simple adjustments, can help everyone using the roads and keep us all as safe as possible.

SIAM's safety campaign supports the Government of India's mission of reducing crashes, injuries and fatalities involving large trucks. As a part of this effort, SIAM's imparted training session for drivers with an aim to educate all truck drivers and allied population on the importance of sharing the road and observance of traffic rules.

SIAM alongwith TCI Foundation organised refresher training sessions and healthcare programs at ten locations in Transport Nagars and on National Highways in different states of India. - To create awareness amongst drivers in terms of maximum speed limit of the vehicle to prevent occurrence of road accidents.
- To maintain the desired speed and maintaining the apt distance from other vehicles.
- To aware people to stop driving while they are under the influence of alcohol or intoxicated.
- To aware drivers on healthy practices.

### **Health Camps**

The medical healthcare camps were organized by the trained and accredited medical and paramedical staff deployed at TCI Foundation clinics and healthcare centres. Specialists at some locations were invited to focus on specific ailments. HIV and blood sugar tests were made mandatory during the campaign to ascertain correlation of profession specific ailments of truck drivers and mechanics.

1302 beneficiaries were benefited through these camps. Through these camps 844 drivers were visited for their health check ups

#### Road Safety Seminars during National Road safety Month 2021

SIAM under the aegis of MoRTH organised two seminars during the National Road Safety Month 2021 for educating and disseminating information on safety standards and holistic approach in bringing the safety through vehicular technology.

First Virtual Seminar on Implementation of Vehicle Location Tracking Devices for Enhancement of Safety on Road on 9th February 2021

Society of Indian Automobile Manufacturers (SIAM) in association with the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways (MoRTH) hosted a virtual seminar on 'Implementation of Vehicle Location Tracking Devices for Enhancement of Safety on Road' on 9th February 2021. Mr Giridhar Aramane, Secretary, MoRTH graced the virtual seminar as the chief guest and elaborated on the importance of vehicular tracking and the Government's role in aiding its implementation to curb road fatalities in India. The seminar highlighted the relevance of vehicular tracking, challenges and opportunities for VLTD manufacturers, regulations and standardization of backend infrastructure for safer roads.





The seminar witnessed participation from eminent industry leaders including Mr Rajesh Menon, Director General, SIAM; Mr Amit Varadan, Joint Secretary, MoRTH; Mr Binoy Paul, Associate Chief Engineer, Mahindra & Mahindra; Mr Kartikeya Joshi, Vice President, Uno Minda Group; Mr K C Sharma, Superintendent Engineer, MoRTH; Mr Roopesh Jenu, Scientist -E, HSTG, C-DAC; Mr Anshuman Roy, Director, Rosmerta Technologies Ltd; Mr Pankaj Singh, Head (Road Safety India), LafargeHolcim. The panel discussion on Next Steps for Harmonization of standard AIS 140 was moderated by Mr B Bhanot, Chairman, TED 28, BIS with representatives from SIAM, ACMA, DIMTS, State government, ARAI and IIT. Mr. P K Banerjee, Executive Director, SIAM moderated the technical session and Q&A session at the end of the panel discussion on Next Steps for Harmonization of standard AIS 140.

The session elaborated on the implementation of innovative and efficient vehicle tracking technology that allows access to vehicle's location at any given time via any connected smart device. The seminar explicitly focused on building backend infrastructure for data transmission via authorized servers, using cellular data aided navigation satellite systems. It also delved into the challenges and opportunities for manufacturers engaged in the installation of such tracking systems.









Passenger buses, commercial vehicles, school buses and cabs/taxis can easily install vehicle location tracking devices for ensuring quick response in emergency environments, merely at the press of a button. It will also allow authorities and police to easily locate the vehicle and avoid any untoward incidents from happening. Moreover, the roll-out and implementation of vehicle tracking devices will also help in managing and navigating through traffic, identifying crimes and curbing illegal activities, thereby making Indian roads safer for citizens.



### Second Virtual Seminar on Emerging Technologies for Safer Mobility



### Road Safety Education Program for Students & General masses in different states of India



The aim of road safety education is to reduce the risk of injury and death to children and young people from road trauma and to lay the foundations for safe road use throughout life.














# SAFE SPEED DRIVING: 1ST NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP ON SAFE SPEED DRIVING

## All Women Teams drove On-Camera with Live Public Tracking from Amritsar to Kanyakumari

An All-Women Teams of Challengers went on a never before mission from Amritsar to Kanyakumari in India's 1st ever national championship on Safe Driving. Believing in "Sadak Suraksha – Jeevan Raksha", Under the banner of Ministry of Road Transport, SIAM alongwith NGO-Drive Smart Drive Safe, FICCI & many other like-minded organisations, have launched an Innovative & Participative Mass Campaign on Road Safety, titled #SafeSpeedChallenge in a format of National Road Safety Championship Challenge. The campaign started on 18th January, during Ministry's 1st ever National Road Safety Month. The championship was flagged off on January 18 by Hon'ble Minister's Rajnath Singh ji & Shri Nitin Gadkari ji.



These women took on a never before mission on a 24x7 Live-On-Camera National Championship of Safe Driving, defeating 3.5 lakh potholes and road risks on Indian roads.



The women challengers included Chaitanya Keloth, , Amritha Arvind, Neha Dua, Garima Avtar & Sunita Dugar. These Challengers drove to Kanyakumari via Amritsar, Chandigarh, Delhi, Jaipur, Udaipur, Vadodara, Mumbai, Goa, Mangalore, Kozhikode/Calicut & Trivandrum. The Rally reached its final destination Kanyakumari on 29th January after travelling 3500 km across the country demonstrating safe speed & safe distance throughout the journey

The All-Women Teams from Amritsar demonstrated Convoy Driving style in Traffic Distancing format by maintaining Safe Speed & Safe Distance between the vehicles and have now become "Role-Model" for all Road Users. The rally was Live with Speed & location tracking.

The objective of the campaign is to start a sustainable chain of Nationwide activities, which will not only make people aware & transform their behaviour on roads, but it will also lead to alerting & assisting drivers directly on road, saving many lives directly and training them silently while participating in a National championship.

The rally has further Motivated Citizens to join National Championship across the country as Popular Game to learn Speed management themselves, through a Mobile App Voice Alerts. Anyone can Download India Against Road Crash App to participate or Register for the Challenge on www. indiaagainstroadcrash.org, take 8 Point Road Safety Pledge, receive instant Participation Certificate & Challenge their Friends & Family by tagging them on social media and Drive safely during Road Safety month, using the App. to slow down when alerted for any safety hazard and Score #SafespeedMiles in Kilometres to Win the championship & take the Trophy home.



The Challenge is also open for organisations & Teams to participate & Top Organisations have "Leader board" visibility separately, other than Individuals for grabbing attention to top the table at www.indiaagainstroadcrash.org . The App Users gets free access to 3.5 Lacs Al generated Road Risk Voice Alerts & optional Personalized Driving Score. Top scorers will receive innovative prozes. On Completion of 1000 Safe Speed Miles, Participants will receive personalized non-clone able Champion Trophy Sticker for their vehicle signed by Hon'ble Minister Mr Nitin Gadkari Minister for Road transport & highways



The campaign is also reaching out to commercial vehicle drivers by rewarding them for driving safe. The campaign aims to sensitise truck drivers on road safety by motivating them to take 8 Point Road Safety Pledge and then download the app and receive incentives for Safe Speed Miles earned during their daily drive. Top winner drivers will get prizes.
